The United Nations Convention on the rights of the Child was agreed by governments across the world in 1989. It says what they must do so that children grow as healthy as possible, can learn at school, receive protection, have their views listen to and are treated fairly. All the rights in the Convention apply to every child, no matter who they are or where they came from.

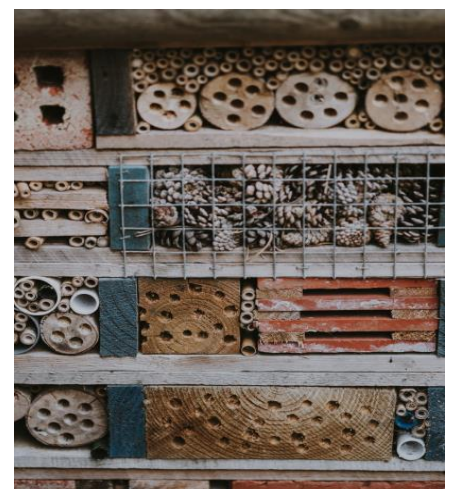

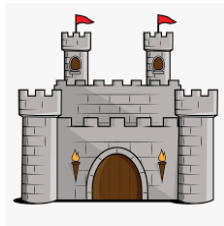
