
Changes to Attendance

The Department for Education (DfE) is changing the guidance on unauthorised leave taken in term time. As of the 19th August 2024, school will be following the guidance a summary is in the image.

School have also emailed all parents/carers with an attendance letter regarding all changes.

PENALTY NOTICE FINES FOR SCHOOL ATTENDANCE IS CHANGING

Penalty Notice Fines will be considered when there has been 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10 week period.

<u>Arbor</u>

Arbor is a simple, smart and cloud-based MIS (Management Information System), which helps us work faster, smarter and more collaboratively as a school. The Parent App and Parent Portal mean we can keep you informed about your child's life at school in a much more accessible way. Log into Arbor to see and update your child's information, get live updates and make payments or bookings on the go!

The <u>Parent Portal</u> works on Google Chrome (computer or laptop) and you can download the Parent App from the App Store or Google Play Store on your phone (Android 5.0; iOS 10.0 and upwards).

We are going to be using Arbor's features more this year, below are some examples:

- Check vour child's attendance
- Book After School Clubs
- Book Parent Consultations
- Pay for School Meals
- Any Trips/Activities will need parent consent via Arbor
- All Parent Consents will be set via Arbor
- Parents can update contact details ensuring we have the most up-to-date emergency contact numbers available
- In App communication is free and an efficient way of getting school updates immediatley.



What do ducks like to eat?

- Please do not feed them oranges, mushrooms, bread, crackers, cereals
- Sweetcorn and peas (frozen or tinned)
- Lettuce (bag or a ball of lettuce)
- Tinned potatoes
- Tomatoes (cherry or normal)
- Oats
- Veg beans, cucumber, cabbage, broccoli, spinach, kale
- Hard boiled eggs
- Seeds squash, pumpkins, tomatoes, melons, mangos, pomegranates
- Greens, herbs and weeds cut grass from the garden, fresh herbs like oregano, basil, mint, parsley
- Fruits strawberries, blueberries, watermelon, melon, pears, peaches, banana (they like frozen berries too)

Our school are trying to develop the Quack Shack to make it the best we possibly can for the ducks to live but also, to make it as sustainable as possible.

If anyone would like to donate anything towards our ducks, we are looking for the following items:

- Hay bail for bedding or bags of animal bedding
- Herbs to plant in pots (living herbs or seeds) Rosemary, peppermint, chives & coriander.
- Old bags of compost, grow bags and topsoil
- Egg boxes (to allow us to collect the eggs and sell them)
- Clover and grass seed

- Planters, troughs & large plant pots
- Fruit and vegetable seeds
- Large rocks, stones and rockery (no building materials)
- Stackers boxes and large bins to store food
- Plastic pond liner
- Pea gravel
- Wild bird seed
- Egg boxes
