Risk in play.

The best play sometimes involves an element of risk. You all will have climbed trees in the past, some of you probably will have fallen out... What did you do the next time you climbed that tree?

Did you climb to a different branch?

Did you climb a different tree?

Whatever you did, we bet you probably didn't quit tree climbing all together. You will have most likely, rubbed the dirt off your hands and tried again.

In play it is important to know the risk is there, but how do we overcome it? How do we develop our resilience if we don't try again?

This week some of our children shown a fantastic example of just this. Below we have a den, with a walkway, initially this walkway wasn't safe. As soon as too many people walked across the road barrier walkway it bent! The children understood this could potentially cause an injury if it were to break.



Did they quit? NOPE. They found a way to fix it. Check it out. The tyres were built up underneath, to support their weight!

Great show of resilience and risk assessment, well done to all the children involved in building this.

What do Ducks like to Eat?

Please do not feed them – oranges,	mushrooms, avocados, bread, crackers, cereals
Sweetcorn and peas (Frozen or tinned)	Greens, herbs and weeds – cut grass from the garden, fresh herbs like oregano, basil, mint, calendula, parsley
Lettuce (Bag or a ball of lettuce)	Fruits – strawberries, blueberries, raspberries, watermelon, melon, pears, peaches, banana
Tinned potatoes - not Potato skins	Seeds – squash, pumpkins, tomatoes, melons, mangos, pomegranates, wild bird seed
Tomatoes	Hard boiled eggs with shells
Oats	Veg – beans, cucumber, cabbage, broccoli, spinach, kale

Our school are trying to develop the Quack Shack to make it the best we possibly can for the ducks to live but also, to make it as sustainable as possible.

If anyone would like to donate anything towards our ducks, we are looking for the following items:

- Hay bail for bedding or bags of animal bedding
- Herbs to plant in pots (living herbs or seeds)
 Rosemary, peppermint, chives & coriander.
- Old bags of compost, grow bags and topsoil
- Egg boxes (to allow us to collect the eggs and sell them)
- Clover and grass seed

- Planters, troughs & large plant pots
- Fruit and vegetable seeds
- Large rocks, stones and rockery (no building materials)
- Stackers boxes and large bins to store food
- Plastic pond liner
- Pea gravel
- Wild bird seed
