# **Group Chats**

To follow on from the Safeguarding update email last week regarding social media can we highlight the below to all parents:

The importance of privacy, respect, and kindness in all online interactions.

- That sharing, possessing, or distributing indecent images of anyone under 18 is a serious matter with both emotional and legal consequences.
- The necessity of reporting any inappropriate behaviour or content to a trusted adult immediately.
- The benefits of parental controls, open conversations about online activity, and monitoring social media use

Instructions below on how to change WhatsApp settings so you are not automatically added to groups:

You can change your WhatsApp settings to require approval before being added to a group. Here's how:

#### On Android & iPhone:

- 1. Open WhatsApp.
- 2. Go to Settings:
  - On Android: Tap the three dots (top right) > Settings
  - · On iPhone: Tap Settings (bottom right)
- 3. Select Privacy.
- 4. Tap on Groups.
- 5. Choose who can add you to groups:
  - Everyone Anyone can add you directly.
  - My Contacts Only people in your contacts can add you.
  - My Contacts Except... Select specific contacts who cannot add you.
- If you choose My Contacts Except..., you can select all contacts to force all group invites to require your approval.
- 7. Tap Done to save the settings.

Now, when someone tries to add you to a group, you'll receive an invite instead of being added automatically. You can then choose to accept or decline the invite within three days.

# **World Book Day**




