Pyjama Day


We thought it would be really fun to come to school dressed in pyjamas/onesies and bring in a favourite bedtime story from home to share!




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Pharmacy 1st


Children with the following illnesses, can attend the pharmacy, no appointment required, and be seen in a clinical setting.

The conditions are as follows:


Sore Throat




Earache


