<u> Author Visit – David Almond</u>


This week, Years 5 & 6 had a very special visitor: Author - David Almond.

Since studying Skellig in September, many of the children in upper KS2 have been inspired by his work and have gone on to read many more of his books or buy their own copies of Skellig to enjoy again.

David spoke to the children all about the power of the human imagination, the writing process, his inspirations for his stories, his career and his childhood in Felling. He shared his notebooks, telling us that he uses these as



part of his journey to creating a new story, "They are not perfect, but it's boring being perfect!"



The children had some fantastic questions and were genuinely amazed to meet someone whom stories they have enjoyed so much.

David said, "I had a grand time this morning in your school. What a lovely place it is. The children were great - attentive, cheerful and responsive and they had so many interesting and intelligent questions. Thanks to all for making me feel so welcome."

David left our school with a box full of duck eggs, a Lingey duck and a parting challenge: A school with ducks in - you tell the story....

School Dinner Money

If your child is in **Y3 - Y6** and has a school meal, Gateshead Council require the payment for those to be made in advance via Arbor the cost per day is **£2.70 (13.50 per week)**.

Payments are expected in advance for all school meals. Payment should be made on Arbor prior to Monday morning for any meals required during the week. Payments can be made weekly, monthly or termly as preffered by the parent.

If you think that you may be entitled to free school meals, please complete an application <u>via</u> this link.

If you cannot access your Arbor account, please contact the school office. Article 24: We all have the right to information which keeps us safe and healthy.

Parental Consent

Early Years - Children in Nursery and Reception are welcome to bring in food from home to feed the ducks on their set days and we will prepare this in class.

Rest of the School – During OPAL each day, children will be allowed to feed the ducks at lunchtime with Miss Brown and Mr Burrell. If you are wanting to feed the ducks, please bring food into school and keep this with you in your class until lunch time. Please remember duck food needs to be chopped up into small pieces before feeding them 😊



Early Years Outdoors


