For your own safety, can I please remind you that the staff car park is for staff only. There was a near-miss incident involving 2 cars in the staff car-park this morning.

Children and parents also use the car park as a short cut but there are occasions when staff are still using their cars at this time. To ensure there are no accidents we request that you use the dedicated paths. Parents will be contacted if this continues on an individual basis.
