

Please do not feed them – oranges, mushrooms, avocados, bread, crackers, cereals

Sweetcorn and peas (Frozen or tinned)	Greens, herbs and weeds – cut grass from the garden, fresh herbs like oregano, basil, mint, calendula, parsley
Lettuce	Fruits – strawberries, blueberries, raspberries,
(Bag or a ball of lettuce)	watermelon, melon, pears, peaches, banana
	watermeion, meion, pears, peaches, bahana
Tinned potatoes - not Potato skins	Seeds – squash, pumpkins, tomatoes, melons,
	mangos, pomegranates, wild bird seed
Tomatoes	Hard boiled eggs with shells
Oats	Veg – beans, cucumber, cabbage, broccoli,
	spinach, kale
